People should understand, first, that about 1/3 of the efficacy of any drug is due to the placebo effect (i. e., the patient's own mindset, in having faith the drug will be effective, influences the magnitude of the drug's therapeutic effect). Multiple studies have demonstrated the magnitude of this effect -- in humans, where a doctor can convey the expectation of healing to the patient. Conventional medicine has tried to claim that 100% of the effectiveness of homeopathic remedies is due to the placebo element. But, I (and others) have successfully used homeopathic remedies for years for minor ailments in cats and dogs. It's hard to argue that your pet has an expectation of efficacy in a medicine you give him, whether conventional or homeopathic.

Yes, Homeopathy can be of great help in farm animals, to treat organic nurseries, which rightly perceive the disadvantages of conventional therapies: inability to achieve true healing, as also happens in people, toxicity to the animal treated; quantities of drugs and their metabolites in milk and meat, and the appearance and spread of resistance to antibiotics and anthelmintics, not only compromises the success of animal therapy, but also involves the propagation of resistance factors in the environment. A negative aspect of the current global concern is the emergence of resistance to antibiotics as Dr, Mercola is reporting.

In human patients, the placebo effect may be of real value. however, in veterinary medicine, it will be very rare that a true placebo effect can be of benefit. In human medicine too, there can be no psychotherapeutic effect in homeopathic consultations that can be of benefit to the patient, and in veterinary medicine such consultations can be of benefit to animal owners, but for animals. The practice of homeopathy by veterinarians is accepted by veterinary regulatory bodies around the world, including the Royal College of Veterinarians in the United Kingdom.

The aim of this clinical control trial was to evaluate the efficacy of the classical homeopathic treatment strategy in cases of mild and moderate bovine clinical mastitis compared with antibiotic and placebo treatments. A total of 136 lactating dairy cows with 147 affected quarters from four herds in Germany were randomly assigned to three treatment groups. In cases of pathogenic-positive mastitis, the cure rate after 4 and 8 weeks was similar between the two treatment strategies, homeopathy and antibiotic treatment. The results indicate a therapeutic effect of homeopathic treatment in cases of mild and moderate clinical mastitis. Efficacy of homeopathic and antibiotic treatment strategies in cases of mild and moderate bovine clinical mastitis.

I like to do the maths (simple arithmetic) on this one. If the placebo effect accounts for 33% of the results, that means that 33 people out of a hundred will be cured by the placebo effect. Now, some forms of chemotherapy have an effectiveness of 1.5%. Let's call it 2% to simplify the calculation. We subtract 33% from the effectiveness and get a result of minus 31%. In other words, 33 patients out of a hundred were saved by the placebo effect, and chemotherapy then killed thirty-one of them. Researchers won't do placebo-controlled tests on chemotherapy, on the grounds that "it would be cruel to raise patients' hopes and give them only a placebo." I suspect the real reason is that they too have done the arithmetic of subtracting the placebo effect.

Again, blood tests showed I had hypothyroidism. I told the Doctor I would make a trip to the UK for homoeopathic treatment because there were no proper doctors in Western Australia.
