They had to revert back from the project, as it is difficult to remove the "evil trio (BPA, BPS, BPF)", and find BPA-free cans. Nobody seem to notice that things are usually done for a reason. BPA (and the substitutes) are added to epoxy liner to make it stronger, and at the same time more resilient. Ever seen a can bashed and dented? So have I. This presents difficulties for well meaning companies to switch. In Europe they actually failed to find a good substitute for BPA, so they found a clever workaround - they over-coated the "standard" BPA coating with non-BPA layer. So if it's dented, BPA is unlikely to leach into food. But I notice N American canneries are less prone to do it, because of their greed, and the can users hesitate to pay any premium on cans (I just hear them: "it's only a f---ing can"). Hopefully they will soon realize they are up against the wall, and face reality.

BPA exposure affects various structural and molecular changes of the brain, promoting oxidative stress, changing the expression levels of several crucial genes and proteins, destructive effects on neurotransmitters, excitotoxicity and neuroinflammation, impaired blood-brain barrier function, neuronal damage, effects of apoptosis, altered intracellular Ca²⁺ homeostasis, increased reactive oxygen species, promoted apoptosis and release of intracellular lactate dehydrogenase, decreased axon length, microglial DNA damage, astrogliosis and significantly reduced myelination. Additionally, exposure to BPA increases the risk of developing neurological diseases, including neurovascular (e.g., stroke) and neurodegenerative diseases (e.g., Alzheimer's and Parkinson's).

Furthermore, epidemiological studies demonstrated that the adverse effects of BPA on the neurological development of children contributed to the emergence of serious neurological diseases such as attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), autism spectrum disorder (ASD), depression, emotional problems, anxiety and cognitive problems. disorders. In summary, exposure to BPA compromises human health, promoting the development and progression of neurological disorders.
