Humanity faces serious food safety threats. Leaders in countries affiliated with the World Economic Forum are cracking down on independent farmers and forcing them to comply with draconian new rules in the name of combating fake climate change. Producers of ultra-processed foods are key players in a complex global network of lobbyists where they wield disproportionate power in global food and nutrition policies, according to a new paper published in Agriculture and Human Values.

On that front, the EAT Forum is “dedicated to transforming our food system. The FReSH (Food Reform for Sustainability and Health) initiative aims to transform the global food system.

Partners in the FReSH initiative include Google, Cargill, Syngenta, Unilever, Pepsico and many chemical processors such as BASF, Bayer and DuPont a rather odd group of characters for the development of “a healthy and sustainable dietary plan”. A report by EAT concluded that the transformation they want to impose on our diets “is unlikely to succeed if left to the individual” and “requires a rethinking at a systemic level with tough policy interventions including laws, tax measures, subsidies and sanctions, trade reconfiguration and other economic and structural measures”.

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Members of the Rockefeller family may bear more blame than anyone else in history for steering agriculture away from independent family farms and toward corporate conglomerates. The business practices of WEF partner Cargill along with the “bigger is better” policies enforced by their cronies at the USDA have led to the closure of many local slaughterhouses, forcing farmers to rely on a few corporate mega-slaughterhouses. Add on and on with Bayer, Cargill, Bill Gates, the WHO and the WEF being among those waging war on our food supply. Pesticides used on crops such as corn, wheat, spinach, apples and strawberries can be added to the list containing PFAS.

A handful of certified organic Maine farms came forward in 2022 to report that their crops and livestock were contaminated by the permanent chemicals from sewage sludge fertilizer spread on their fields or neighboring fields, or used by their hay suppliers. We have local organic food and health advocates. Against ultra-processed pesticide-laden foods over the past few decades there has been a rise in peer-reviewed scientific studies showing that certain foods that can be easily purchased at markets can increase your life expectancy, while others reduce your longevity.

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Yes SUE. Maine, one of only two U.S. states where PFAS testing is required, has found that most of its agricultural land, even organic farms, suffers from PFAS contamination. Maine announced a plan to create a \$65 million relief fund for organic farmers whose livelihoods are being devastated by plastic pollution from per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). In the case of agriculture, one of the main sources of PFAS is the use of wastewater waste as fertilizer. During wastewater treatment, solids are separated from liquids and the resulting "biosolids" are sold as fertilizer.

These biosolids may contain PFAS, as the chemicals are not effectively removed during the treatment process. The extent of PFAS contamination on the country's agricultural land is unknown. However, a 2022 estimate from the Environmental Working Group suggests that nearly 20 million acres of U.S. cropland is fertilized with sewage sludge. childrenshealthdefense.org/defender/maine-organic-farmers-65-million-c... The region in which you live and guarantees that they reach the consumer at their optimum time. These products do not travel hundreds, or thousands, of kilometres to be on the table.

Buying zero-kilometre products strengthens the economic and local fabric of your area. Small producers, farms, neighbourhood shops and traditional commerce, in general, are those who produce and sell local food. Buying in these types of establishments helps to strengthen this commercial network. In addition, by buying in these shops and from local producers you will know where the food comes from, you will know what you eat. You can even establish a direct and trusting relationship with the producer. When you go shopping you can find out when is the best time for tomatoes or why now is the season for strawberries.

While "buying local" is a worthwhile goal, it alone does not guarantee foods are free of toxins. The largest and busiest vegetable stall at the Parker Farmers' Market in Colorado is from a farm that uses fertilizer from an industrial feedlot operation, a CAFO farm, so the vegetables, while they look visually healthy and appealing, likely have petrochemical pesticides, herbicides, hormones, antibiotics, and other pharmaceutical and vaccine residues. The customer must ask questions about the farmers' practices. **KNOWING YOUR FARMER IS KEY.**
