Positive homeschooling statistics, and the people are really still rising up standing strong and fighting in Brazil and Arizona. So we'll go over some of that, too.

Sounds like a plan. Okay, goodness, where do I start? So this is the beast that I was starting to work on before I got sick, and had planned on getting it out a couple of weeks back. And what's funny, though, is like what always happens with my report, anytime it gets delayed, there ends up being more key news that drops during that time, I'm like, Ah, that's why it got delayed. So I was able to work in a couple more really important things that have taken place. And so this was a tricky one for me edge. Because I was trying to focus primarily on this one White House fact sheet that is talking about, essentially all these different food control mechanisms. But there's other aspects to this too. And so it was kind of like this is kind of like building on the report that I've already done pertaining to food, except for all the other ones I've done are more specific to the food itself. Whereas this is, there's some of that in here. But this is mostly about how it is they're going to lock into place, the control mechanisms of it, and how they're doing this. These people are just so savvy and by people, the main instigator behind most of this is of course, the Rockefellers. No surprise there, I'm sure. But what we've got is this new food is medicine that they've been working on for a few years now. And it's all coming to light. And what it what they're doing is they're rolling it into healthcare. And you can imagine why, because once you get stuff under that umbrella, imagine how much more control you have. Because now you're pulling in the health insurance and the FDA, and the USDA and the the hospitals, the medical facilities physician, you're getting all those people on board with this. And you start making new policies and regulations. And so, so what this what I started out with is oh, let's see, how do I break this down? Basically on September 28, the White House announced 8 billion in new commitments towards hunger, nutrition and health. And they had had this conference that laid out the transformational vision for ending hunger and reducing diet related disease by 2030. Now, these commitments were actually determined over the summer. And you've got your private and public sector. Wonderful people funding this. So you've got you know philanthropic contributions and donations to community based organizations, investments in new businesses that will screen and integrate nutrition into healthcare. Yes, there's nutritional screening involved in this. We've got medical meals, we've got produce prescriptions, medical groceries, all the food, the whole, the whole snap trap, WIC, Medicaid, all of it. So they put 2.5 billion in startup companies creating solutions to hunger and food insecurity, and over 4 billion toward philanthropy that improves access to nutritious foods, promotes healthy choices and increases physical activity. So I ask, did the people who want to depopulate really care how much fruit and vegetables you're eating? No, are they really about making us healthy to where they're now going to train hundreds of 1000s of physicians in nutrition suddenly, after all these decades of people complaining about the shit, they get

fed in hospitals, and how nutrition is never taken into account. It's unbelievable. So. So in addition to this, which we'll go over this, this, I sort of broke down these organizations and some of the things they're doing. But in addition to that, on November 16, the FDA just completed its pre market consultation for upside foods, animal cell culture technology, to produce chicken from cultured chicken cells. Now, I've been covering this stuff for four years, and talking about the different companies and keeping people up to date on where they were at with all this. And then last year, they had started working on the labeling the FDA and USDA was already on board with this. So this isn't like some new approval. What this is, is they were they were it's a step in the process to bring it to market. So it's here's what's so crazy. These cell lines, here, let me let me read this. So this is JT Hanson, the Policy Director of the Center for Food Safety. And what he says in regards to this press release that came out by the FDA and upside foods, which of course gates and a bunch of others are invested in and they just launched recently in California. What he says is that the FDA is approval is grossly inadequate. In this pre market consultation, neither the company nor the FDA presented the actual data from tests looking at the effects of raising the cells in fetal bovine serum, and enzymes from the intestines and pancreas of animals. While the company notes that it uses genetic engineering to keep the cells growing, it fails to share which genes are being used. This is vital information that consumers and policymakers need to know to make informed decisions in the best interest of public health, we should make certain that genes linked to cancer are not being used. This is a woefully deaf deficient review by the FDA who states it has no further questions about this experimental products safety. And so in the press release by the FDA, for those who didn't read it, and I've got it linked to my report, they actually say in there, they're all excited about this, they're like, this is a they're calling this all a new food revolution, and how this now opens the doors where they're inviting other lab grown meat, and, and of course fish to let's not forget about that, too, you know, provide their their work so that the FDA can review that as well. So I I honestly thought that this was already going to be approved into market by the end of this year, but it's looking like it'll probably be next year now. And people need to really pay attention because God knows how they're gonna label this. Right. You know, we've already got we know we we all need to look for the whole bioengineered on the food labels. But the problem is I don't know they were debating all of this. I was following it for a while. Last year and this year on their whole debate on how they're going to label this and that it's not like there's going to be some big bright label that says fake meat. So we don't know we don't know what DNA they're using weed. All right. God only knows what they're doing with this crap. No one else you just gonna want this.

So, so then, just a goodness, couple days ago, on the 21st, a new rule by the FDA at the federal register that I'm sure nobody knows of. And it's regarding requirements for additional traceability records for certain foods. Now, I had talked about this back in gosh, I think it was September of last year over a year ago in my lab grown meat to hit us and 2022 that it added up along with smarter food safety blueprint and traceability all under way. So, so this new rule creates additional record keeping requirements for persons who manufacture process pack or hold foods the FDA has designated for inclusion on the food traceability list, it cracks me up, they use the word inclusion, not regulated, but inclusion to make you feel special. So, so they basically are going to track the packing the shipping receiving tract and transforming of foods across the supply chain under the guise of preventing foodborne illness. This is going into effect in January, I linked their 179 page document that I did not read, but I zipped down to the list of foods and they've got various cheeses, shell eggs, nut butters, herbs, leafy greens, tomatoes, peppers, cucumber sprouts, fresh cut fruits and vegetables, fin fish and crustaceans. And when I look at that I go, Huh, okay, indoor growing facilities. Let's see with the fish. They're trying to take over that whole industry just like they're trying to do with the meats. So it's interesting that they're wanting to track these specifically. Now, one could argue well, sure, because those some of those are the ones that could become more easily contaminated. No, I see this as a way to take out the competition. That's how I view this. Let's track them all. And then let's continue to regulate them and make things difficult, and then we'll penalize them and then we'll put them out of business. So essentially, they've got between the other food reports I've done and this year, what I'm seeing is this threefold event going down here, and they're putting all these pieces into place simultaneously. And what kills me I just, it's like this slow burn, right? Like for me, I feel like this is all happening right now this minute because I already know the whole pick Sure, right. But for other people, it's like this very slow burn, very gradual thing. And then one day, all of

a sudden, they're not going to be able to buy certain things from the grocery store, or they're going to be put onto this loyalty card that's now controlled by the state with your food tokens. And it's all going to click very quickly, but worth their targeting in order to get because, you know, they always have to kind of pilot things out and aggregate the data so they can take it and justify their, their motives. So they're focused on getting as many people on the snap, and WIC, and Medicaid as possible. I mean, they're literally. So it's funny, because they spin it like, well, we're gonna help you out so that you can become more self sufficient. But then you read their actual material, and their plans and strategies on what they're doing. And they are going gung ho on recruiting as many people as they can. And then they even talk about, well, then what happens is when the on the WIC programs is when the kids started to grow up than the parents just stop using the WIC, well, didn't you want them to become self sufficient? I mean, how many years? Do you want people on this? Right? So so that's,

So, you know, by doing all those things, it puts all the food in their basket, and then they can control who they're rolling it out to and how much is being rolled out. So I'm not gonna go through all these names, but it's pretty evident. What's going on just by looking at this and this is right from the White House facts sheet on all of these organizations that are planning to you know, help with food insecurity. And of course in pillar one, improve food access and affordability. Look at that Bowery farming is in there. They were in my home indoor vertical farming, our vertical vertical farming report that I did. But I mean, you've got grocery stores in here. We get into integrate nutrition and health we've we've got, you know, Blue Cross Blue Shield. You've got

everything from some big rochers to the of course, Rockefeller's to, uh, do we have Google in here and DoorDash and Instacart because that's all part of it, too. We need to get the whole loyalty cards in the online the other day they want to expand SNAP and WIC to more online grocers. And then we come down to pillar three empower consumers to make and have access to healthy choices. We've got pillar four of course, Tyson Foods is in there. support physical activity for all. Hey, I'm all for that one. Let's all do pillar four. Pillar five, enhance nutrition and food security research. Okay, so this behind the smoke screens, this little diagram of there's pretty much says it all. I mean, I could have just published this and not written anything I mean, good is my I love when they put the word intervention in there, they're gonna intervene for us and change our lives and just make things so much better. Food is Madison intervention pyramid. I don't lose my voice. Medically tailored meals, medically tailored groceries, produce prescriptions, incentives for nutritional security, federal nutrition assistance and emergency food programs. Okay. So this is their their new pyramid of how they want to control this food industry. And coincidentally, they just had a Codex Alimentarius just had a big meeting. And yesterday, of course, Tadros was there from the who, and saying how we need to totally transform the food industry as we know it, just completely transform it. So this is all the One Health approach which is all backed and funded by the Rockefellers.

Yes, please give me a couple of those. So what I did is I kind of rolled this out as smoke screens. On people can go on and read the more detailed specifics, I'll just kind of hit on a few of them. So the food is medicine, obviously, that was the biggest, biggest smokescreen of all, and the Rockefellers Partner Foundation partnered with the American Heart Association and Kroger. Coincidentally, when you look at the deal going on with Kroger and Albertsons and all that. So they mobilize this food is medicine research initiative that's going to generate the definitive evidence necessary for the health sector to develop food is medicine programs. And their goal is to accelerate public understanding and use of food and medicine programs is an integral part of the health care system. So I mean, I'm not making this stuff up. When I'm saying this, I know, they say it right there. In their own words, this is their intention. This is how they're going to do this. This is how they're going to get us all under that digital ID. That's controlling the food and the money, and the healthcare and all that good stuff. So there's also Rockefellers are involved in the center for good food purchasing, which is a whole new thing they launched with the Kellogg Foundation. And Michael and Susan Dell Foundation, of course, you know, Eric Schmidt's involved. And this is the whole new, they're setting the standards for good food. And they

have these different categories and the certifications. And so I'm sure that's going to become a thing. Because they're, it's the first of its kind. And they're rolling in the genomic surveillance, which we've talked about in the past, but that is going to go right through the whole food industry as well. So So to give an example of one of these, Blue Cross in North Carolina has been rolling out they started back in 2018. They have this equal program, and they're working with rewards managed by reinvestment partners, who courses again funded by Rockefellers, as well as our government, and this is food vouchers and medically tailored meals and they say here, the future reinvestment partners seeks to streamline its eat well program, including expanding healthcare provider participation, expanding grocery retailer participation, and introducing automatic enrollment from electronic health records completed by the health care provider. They will continue to collect Like data and adapt programming to respond to the data in real time, including testing the feasibility of sliding scale benefits. So I look at that and I go Hmm, so smokers always, you know, they gotta pay more for usually there's there's a higher rate because you smoke on your health insurance or we can't cover you because of these pre existing Well, let's start rolling food and diet into that and see what kinds of restrictions start playing apart.

So people could kind of get perspective on some of the different ways they could try and roll this stuff out. So the second one, the the trap, which is, you know, I call it the snap trap. And I won't go into this because we kind of talked about it earlier, I of course had to work in that diagram from Illinois that I had in my book about, you know, trying to shop and then the cheeseburger gets put outside the cart. I'd like to find diagrams from other states, if anyone has seen diagrams similar to this in their states on what they're planning on for their food stamps, or snaps or different programs. With their digital wallets, and the smart contracts and the eating healthy stuff. So shoot them over to me, I would I would love to see more diet, because I guarantee you there's more out there. So, um, you know, and then they're, they're working on, like ARP, right, they got 30,000,030 8 million people over the age of 50. And their goal is to improve snap enrollment by researching non participants that are eligible to inform policy advocacy and boost awareness to get more adults enrolled by 2024. Now, why, why? I mean, this is this is just clear cut to me. Okay, so smoke scan screen three, no need for traditional farming. This kind of recaps the other report I did on the gene editing, and points out that Bowery farming is in this one, as well. And then we've got smokescreen for it. Now. This is one that really irks me. So a new diet for children. Isn't that a great photo image I found? Wow. So but this is no joke, because they're they are already testing this in schools in some other countries with the whole insects, edible insects for kids. So when we've got all these programs being thrown at trying to improve nutrition for kids in schools across all 50 states, and we've got companies like Tyson trying to train kids in schools and families in nutritious products, not nutritious meat, but nutritious products, our protein products, sorry, protein products. This is a huge red flag for me. And so we've got like in the Netherlands, they're doing this taste mission adventurous proteins campaign to feed children, mealworms, and insects, and Australia, Canada, UK, they're all implementing these edible insects into children's schools. So this is where I see this crap going. They're going to start educating children on, you know what real nutrition is. And let's start introducing this into the cafeterias. And, you know, you've got the public schools, kinder cares, Boys and Girls Clubs, YMCA, National Restaurant Association, they're all in on this. Of course, of course, Warner Brothers discoveries. And on this too, they're gonna get all kinds of healthy meals out there. And they're going to make sure that they you know, get this out on television. So then we've got training hundreds of 1000s of physicians in nutrition, which is suddenly becoming an important thing. Never was before. So what are they going to train them in? We've got the American Academy of Pediatrics, planning to train 67,000 pediatricians on screening for nutrition. So this is what this is really about. Right? They're gonna start. And that's just one, there's a bunch in here. They're going to start training people on how to screen for nutrition. So they can be like the hall monitors. Right? That's what that's about. You got 10 medical associations and pharmaceutical companies that have made a pledge to train health professionals and nutrition education, they're even going to boost credit values. So they're changing the whole teaching system. And adding credit stole this. So then we've got convenience or control, um, and this one. So let's see. Let me show you this one. So we've got with biometrics, we've got the sync for social needs coalition. Think of that sync for social need is uniting leading health technology companies and health systems to standardize and share patient data on social detriments of health, including food security. Hmm. This also includes the Department of Veterans Affairs. So what they're doing is they're going to evaluate and pilot the integration of specific social screening tools to electronic medical systems. Hmm. And then I'm sure you have about 10 things to say about that. The Domon company Foundation's food benefit company plans to contract with companies to provide employees with nutrition coaching, biometric screening, and fresh food delivery. And this one I found very interesting. So they suggest that by avoiding running to the grocery store on the way home from work, or going to a restaurant, it would be much healthier if a person just grabbed their family dinner right out of the

employee fridge. So that healthy meal is prepared for you. In addition to that, their comprehensive system includes personalized biometrics and formed health coaching, delivered right through a holistic app on your cell phone. So So what does that tell you? I mean, that's a whole new pilot program where what they're going to tie in the hell, they're going to tie this into business, they're going to build up a whole new Christian nutrition thing through these big businesses and corporations, to where, oh, here's your meals already prepared for you. And this is what your and your family are gonna get to eat.
